How do you feel today?

Let's make a mood board! **You will need:** A piece of cardboard (you can use part of a cereal box etc), cello tape, paper, pens (whiteboard pens are best but felt tips are good too!)

You can make this however you like, be as creative as you wish! attach your piece of paper to the box, Use the cello tape to wrap around the whole cardboard covering all of the paper, so that when we're finished we can rub it off easily!

For this week, every morning when you get up and every night before you go to bed, I want you to draw on your mood board how **you** feel! Talk to your grown up about how you feel and why you feel this way! **challenge: have a go at writing the word too!**

Can you draw a picture of what makes you feel happy? Excited? Sad? Frightened?

How do you think mummy/Daddy is feeling today? Why do you think this?
