Phonics Play:
Username: march20

Find Phase Two (red books) or Phase Three
(green books) on the left hand side of the
screen.

Watch: Learn to Read – Alphablocks
(Youtube)

3 in a row!

You will need: cake cases (or pieces of paper),
cake case tin, counters (if you don't have any it's
okay, you can use alternatives!)

Write inside your cake cases/ pieces of paper,
our familiar sounds that we know such as:

**m, a, c, k, b, d, f, t, l, n, o, u, q, e, r, g, h,
j, s etc!**

The aim of the game is to get 3 cake cases in a
row, the first person to get three in a row, wins!
You can use counters/ small pieces of paper, to
place in the cake case once you have claimed it
or even a small toy, marker etc, as long as you
know it's yours!

One player goes first and picks a cake case/
paper, the player must then say the sound which
is on the inside of the cake case and **make a
word you know that sound fits into**, for
example;

**Miss Grimshaw picked the "m" sound, I
know that "m" is in "mat, m-a-t"**

Once you have made sure your word is correct,
you can then place your counter/ piece of paper
inside the cake case!

BANG!



Make some cards with your child, writing on
words using our 'special friends', which is a
sound that has two letters but only one sound
such as:

sh, ch, th, qu, oo, ee, ow, ng, nk, ir

Sneakily, write the word **BANG!** on some of
the cards.

Now place them all face down, take it in
turns to read the cards... if you can read them
you get to keep them.

However, if you turn over the word **BANG!**
Then you have to replace all of the cards, and
start all over again!

The winner is the person with the most read
words at the end of the game!

To extend: You can make the game trickier by turning the cake cases inside out, making it a surprise!

Can you try writing the words that you have made?

Challenge: Can you do this game using our special friends sounds? **Remember special friends sounds are two letters, but one sound!**
