- **Don't forget to use the power point in slide show mode. The lesson will work better that way.**





How do we conjugate (form) the present tense of an IR verb in Spanish ?

Using a pen and paper, go through each of the steps and make notes. It's important to make notes or you will get lost!


Let's imagine a flower again ..



Step 1


Take the infinitive (the whole verb)

COMER (to eat)



Step 2


Cut off the er to get the stem COM...



Step 3


Bee- come a person

(here, you have to remember the subject pronouns, so you know which person the verb is referring to)



Step 4


Add these endings to the stem, com.



Step 5

You have conjugated (formed) the verb "COMER" in the present tense!

Repeat those steps, until you think you've got a good idea of them.










What does the verb look

Comer = To eat

como I eat

comes you (singular) eat

come he/she/it/eats

comemos we eat

coméis you (plural) eat

comen they eat



Can you remember why we don't use subject pronouns in Spanish?

In Spanish, all of the endings added to the stem of the verb are different, so we can tell who is talking. In the case of ER verbs, it's as follows:

O = I ending

ES = You (talking to one person) ending

E = He/She (and also It) ending

EMOS = We ending

ÉIS = You (talking to more than one person) ending

EN = They ending



By following the previous steps can you work out how to conjugate this regular ER verb in Spanish?




